For Kids Foundation Clothing/Shoes Alternative Funding Sources

Clothing: Clothing closets may provide very low income families free clothes and needed household items. This is often done by issuing a voucher, which will allow the client to acquire what they need. The goal is to not turn anyone away, so the clothes closets also partner with thrift stores in Reno, which often help more moderate income households. Find some or all of the following from the centers.

- Personal hygiene kits.
- Clothes for work, such as suits, work boots, pants, dresses, and more.
- Children from struggling households can apply for free back to school supply programs.

The hours are limited, and Washoe area families should call in advance. Also, not every person will qualify for free clothes or goods. So they can try a thrift store instead. Whether the supplies are given for free, or at a reduced price, assistance is available.

Salvation Army Nevada Assistance Programs

The Salvation Army in Nevada is committed to providing low income families with help. The programs available will vary by center and location, but many Nevada sites offer Family Services, may have limited amounts of financial assistance available, provide referrals and case management to low-income individuals and families in the region.

As indicated, the exact type and amount of resources will vary by location listed below and region of Nevada. However many Salvation Army centers provide some or all of the following:

- Food assistance, including an onsite pantry and grocery distribution. Many centers also have case managers who can help people apply for government commodities and food stamps.
- Free vouchers can be distributed for a number of needs. They can be passed out for gasoline, food, and clothing items at local Salvation Army thrift stores in Nevada.
- Bus passes to be used to get to jobs or a doctor appointment.
- Utility and electric bill assistance through various state and programs offered in partnership with utility companies.
- Rental assistance through the ESSP Program. Find more information rent help.
- Personal hygiene items and household products.
- Coats for Kids, especially during the winter.
- Community Care Ministries, which is volunteers visiting nursing homes & hospitals.
- Back to School Fair can distribute free items such as notebooks or school supplies.
- Angel Tree Christmas Connection provides free holiday toys, gifts, meals and more to low income families, children, and seniors.
- Summer Camp opportunities, including meals and snacks for students during the summer or holiday breaks.
- Job training and vocational Programs.
- Those with a severe medical need can look into prescription drug assistance, which may be offered. It is mostly offered for those who have no health insurance, and who are faced with a very serious medical condition.

Limited financial assistance may be offered from some Nevada centers, depending on donations and the applicant's exact need. This can include emergency rental and electric bill assistance for those faced with disconnection or eviction. Some funds for water bills may be offered too, but that is rarer.

Meeting nutritional needs of low income families, the elderly, and seniors is a key function of the Salvation Army centers in Nevada. Many locations have an onsite food pantry and/or a soup kitchen. They can offer free canned groceries, hot meals, and other nutritional support. Or get help in applying for government programs such as WIC or food stamps. Special holiday meals, including Easter, Thanksgiving, or Christmas meals may be served too. Find more Nevada food pantries.

Free Holiday and Christmas assistance may be offered, including from programs such as Adopt a Family and Angel Tree. Children can get toys or clothing, and families can get a free meal with all the trimmings. The Salvation Army is always committed to ramping up their assistance programs during the holidays.

Homeless services are offered in order to help clients get a job, obtain the income and locate affordable housing. Social workers help people become self-sufficient, independent citizens of the community, and

they try to eliminate homelessness in Nevada. Case management, security deposit/rental assistance, shelter, and other transformational resources are available.

Education and job training is coordinated. The Salvation Army works with businesses, colleges, and other non-profits across the state so they can provide clients practical work experience in a variety of fields and academic training. They also offer classes in life skills, credit counseling, and offer other essential employment tools.
